Feet of Clay Aren't Bronze

FRANKFORT, Ky. (AP) — Henry Clay's statue, which has stood in the state Capitol Rotunda since 1930, isn't cast in bronze as most people suspected.

Walker Hancock, a Boston, Mass. artist, said he discovered the statue was solid plaster

recently when he was here to set up the statue of former Vice President Alben Barkley.

Hancock, who noticed a broken finger on the statue, said "there seems to be a gold paint undercoat and then black paint over that to give the bronzed effect."

He recommended to state officials that the Clay statue be cast in bronze before it falls apart.
